Minimum wages in Germany

The statutory minimum wage in Germany has applied generally and across the country to all employees (with a few exceptions) since January 1, 2015.

Important:

The general minimum wage will be raised to <u>12 euros</u> per hour from October 1, 2022!

In some industries, there are also branch-specific minimum wages that have been negotiated by trade unions and employers in a collective agreement and declared generally binding by politicians. Branch-specific minimum wages, which exist, among others, in temporary employment, in building cleaning, in care, etc., may not be lower than the statutory minimum wage and apply to the employees of the particular branch. Minimum wage for foreign employees

All employees working in Germany are entitled to the applicable minimum wage. This also applies if a person, or the company employing them, comes from abroad, for example, to caregivers in private households, cross-border workers, truck drivers etc.

Seasonal workers who work for a limited period of time, e.g. in the hotel and restaurant sector, in agriculture or at Christmas markets, are also entitled to the minimum wage!

Payment

In Germany, the following principle applies: No work should be without payment!

If you have not been paid the minimum wage, you can claim it within three years and sue for it in a German court. This period is regulated by law and cannot be undercut. In the case of branch minimum wages, however, other deadlines regulated by collective agreements must be followed.

Important: Even without work papers and employment contract, the employer owes you your wage!

Exceptions to the statutory minimum wage

According to \$22 MiLoG, the following groups are exempt from the right to statutory minimum wage:

- Long-term unemployed persons during the first six months of their employment
- Trainees within the framework of professional training
- Certain groups of interns

In addition, the following groups are usually excluded:

- Young people under the age of 18 who have not completed their education or training
- Volunteers
- Freelancers
- Self-employed
